B. SPECIAL REPORT

Enhancing STEM Education (ESTEME)

Enhancing STEM Education at Oregon State University, ESTEME@OSU, is an NSF-funded project which began in Winter 2014. The goals are to build community and to increase the use of evidence-based instructional practices (EBIPs), especially in large, introductory-level STEM courses. EBIPs are incorporated in both large lecture classes and smaller studio workshops and laboratories. Inaugural participants include: Integrative Biology, Chemistry, Mathematics, Physics, Chemical, Biological, and Environmental Engineering, and Civil and Construction Engineering. All units are welcome!

Milo Koretsky will update the Faculty Senate on the status of this project. Targeted initiatives for 2016-2017 include an Action Research Fellows program and a regional workshop (May 2016) to help faculty learn how to incorporate undergraduate learning assistants in their classroom practice. We seek to work with the Senate as we move toward Institutional Integration and Sustainability.
