Academic Advising Council

Standing Rules proposed revisions – mark-up version

Proposed additions are indicated as bolded blue text and proposed deletions are indicated as blue strike-through text.

Standing Rules:

The Academic Advising Council furnishes support and information to those units on campus that provide academic advising for undergraduate students and makes policy and procedure recommendations to the Faculty Senate for consideration.

The Council shall be composed of a Head Advisor or designated representative from each academic college and one or more representatives from each service unit involved in advising undergraduate students, and a student representative. Each of the academic colleges and the service units represented shall have one vote on the council. A change in the Standing Rules is required to add or delete a voting member.

The Chair and Secretary shall be chosen by the Council in a manner to be determined by that body. The process for election of the Council chair and the three-year slate of responsibilities for the position are delineated in the Academic Advising Council guidelines. The immediate past chair of AAC shall participate on the Faculty Recognition and Awards Committee in selecting the recipient of the Dar Reese Excellence in Advising and the OSU Academic Advising Award and shall be a liaison member of the Curriculum Council. In the event that the individual cannot fulfill his or her duties, the AAC chair will appoint a replacement.

ACADEMIC ADVISING COUNCIL MEMBERSHIP: (voting members, limited to one (1) vote/unit):

Head Advisors: Includes each of the academic colleges that advise undergraduate students, as well as Honors College, University Exploratory Studies Program, and the OSU-Cascades: Voting Members are limited to one vote per unit, but one or more representatives from the unit may attend meetings. See the Council Guidelines for additional guidelines regarding membership.

Voting members include representatives from the undergraduate degree-granting colleges and service units that connect to or support academic advising.

- Academics for Student Athletes, College Assistance Migrant Program, Educational Opportunities Program, INTO OSU, Trio Student Support Services added to voting member

- Office of Dean of Dean of Students, Office of Global Opportunities, Diversity and Cultural Engagement, Faculty Senate Liaison, Veteran's Services and Financial Aid added to nonvoting
- Student Conduct deleted membership
- Included non-voting members in the standing rules section (moved from guidelines below); previously only delineated in the guidelines
- All membership decisions were based on a survey that was done last year and on examination of the membership definition and the work done by each of these offices
- For clarity, the Academic Advising Council made the decision to consolidate standing rules, membership, and guidelines into a single document.

Standing Rules proposed revisions – clean version
