Gary,

Thank you again for your review of proposal to move the Hospitality Management BA/BS to Ecampus. In conversation with Todd Montgomery, he has confirmed that the program is currently offered site-based on the Cascades campus. In further response to your assessment:

- Curriculum: Note that the curriculum as it is outlined in the Ecampus proposal is in alignment with the program description in the OSU Catalog, and thus would meet the Curriculum Council's oversight guidelines. The issues you've pointed out regarding pre-requisite courses will be addressed via CAT-II's.
  - All of the HM courses listed in the online catalog indicate (Pending approval); see the attached online Catalog entry below.
  - The Fall Term 2015 enrollment in the HM program was one (1). Only one student is currently enrolled in the Hospitality Management program. It is assumed that this student is pursuing available lower division and Baccalaureate Core courses.
  - OSU-Cascades has only submitted one Category II proposal to create courses under the HM course designator even though the BS in Hospitality Management degree program was approved a year ago by HECC back on February 12, 2015. The effective term for this new course proposal, which is currently routing through the CPS, is Fall Term 2016.
  - The original program was designed and structured as a face-to-face (F2F) program. There was no mention of delivering the program online via Ecampus.
  - A total of 57 courses will need to be developed; 27 (F2F on the OSU-Cascades campus) and 30 (online which would be delivered by Ecampus).

- Regarding the preponderance of courses that have not yet been submitted for formal CAT-II approval: This issue was addressed as part of the initial CAT-I proposal. Essentially, the pending courses will be developed in sequence as the program, site based and online, accrue degree seeking student expanding the enrollment base and thus warranting the development of those courses. It is standard practice on Cascades campus to rollout new courses in phases for new programs with a focus on Freshman students, as a part of financial as well as enrollment management. As you've pointed out, the curricular issue is not an specifically an issue with the Ecampus proposal, but rather, it is a Cascades campus issue. This was articulated as part of the discussion for the original CAT-I program proposal for the site-based program. Having said that, the Ecampus proposal would greatly accelerate course development for F2F as well.
  - In essence, both the OSU-Cascades (F2F) and Ecampus (Online) versions of the program are going to be rolled-out just a few terms ahead of the students. Note: We don't know what the schedule is for course development.
  - The statement "with a focus on Freshman students" is not exactly true. Up until OSU-Cascades was granted four-year status, all lower division courses came from Central Oregon Community College or from

transfers from other colleges/universities. OSU-Cascades was not allowed to offer freshman and sophomore courses.

- Cascades Culinary Institute (CCI): CCI is not involved with any part of the program delivery. Students can take culinary classes at culinary schools all over Oregon and the US. CCI is reference in the OSU Catalog description as a recommended site where these courses because of the proximity to OSU Cascades and its unique relationship with Central Oregon Community College, wherein CCI is located.
  - In the original proposal, only the CCI courses were listed. There was no mention that courses from other culinary schools would be acceptable. I don't believe that there has been any course articulations by the Admissions Office from other institutions.
- Tourism and Outdoor Leadership courses: The TOL program is going through a number of curriculum changes and the Hospitality Management Program can easily adjust in response to those changes.
  - A proposal from the College of Forestry/OSU-Cascades has not been submitted to merge the TOL and RRM programs. We don't know what changes will be coming forward for these two degree programs.
- Total program credit requirement: Note that the credit counts were taken directly from the original program Cat-I proposal, which was reviewed and received full curricular approval. We can only assume that any differences are related to changes from other programs over the last 2 years.
  - I'm not sure how a total number of credit hours of 181-190 got through the review process. But obviously it did. This needs to be corrected. OSU is not authorized to offer a four-year bachelor's degree program in excess of 180 credit hours. The only exception are a couple of Engineering degree programs at 192 which require this number of credit hours as part of their ABET accreditation. Once this correction is made, then the total number of credit hours per category will need to be adjusted.

In light of this, we would appreciate moving the proposal to Curriculum Council for review. Todd Montgomery and I can be available to respond to questions as they are raised by the Council.

Alfonso,

Per your request, listed below and identified in the attached proposal document, is my review of the OSU-Cascades proposal to deliver their BS in Hospitality Management program online via delivery by Ecampus.

Observations:

- (1) The on-campus, face-to-face (OSU-Cascades) version is not yet fully operational. Only the Bac Core and six of the courses have been developed for face-to-face delivery. A total of 27 courses still remain to be developed for face-to-face-delivery and 30 courses would need to be developed for online delivery by Ecampus.
- (2) Of the required courses for the program, the following courses have not been submitted for review and approval:

Food and Beverage (21): Only CUL 110. Culinary Foundations I (4) currently exists face-to-face but it is not available online  
Cascades Culinary Institute (courses to be developed; both face-to-face and online)

CUL 150. Hospitality Cost Control (4)  
CUL 190. Introduction to Food Service Operations – Elevation Lunch (5)  
CUL 200. Comprehensive Kitchen Operations (4)  
CUL XXX. Advanced Restaurant Management and Ownership (4)

General (45): Only BA 487. Hospitality Financial Management (4) currently exists face-to-face but it is not available online  
OSU-Cascades (courses to be developed; both face-to face and online)

HM XXX. Lodging Management (4)  
HM XXX. Hospitality Law and Labor Relations (4)  
HM XXX. Hospitality Technology (4)  
HM XXX. Core Competencies in the Hospitality Industry (4)

OSU-Cascades (courses to be developed online—face-to-face currently exists)

BA Language (18): Only SPAN 111. First-Year Spanish (4) and SPAN 112. First-Year Spanish (4) currently exists face-to-face and online  
OSU-Cascades (courses to be developed face-to-face)  
SPAN 113. First-Year Spanish (4)  
SPAN 211. Second-Year Spanish (4)  
SPAN 212. Second-Year Spanish (4)  
SPAN 213. Second-Year Spanish (4)

No other foreign language is available face-to-face at OSU-Cascades. [Note: Spanish and German, 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> year are available online.]

(3) Prerequisites (the following enforced prerequisites are NOT available for the following courses)

Cascades Culinary Institute

CUL 110. WR 065 or WR 095 with “C” grade or above or placement exam score that places student into WR121 or completion of WR 121 or higher with “C” grade or above; RMGT 090; CUL 102.

OSU-Cascades

BA 360: BA 215 and AEC 250

BA 390: AEC 250

SPAN 113: SPAN 111; SPAN 112 (both courses do exist face-to-face and

online)

SPAN 211: SPAN 113

SPAN 212: SPAN 211

SPAN 213: SPAN 211; SPAN 212

In addition to the issues identified above, the following errors/issues exist in OSU’s current online Catalog and within the attached proposal. Each of these problems need to be addressed.

- (1) No HM courses have been approved since the program was approved back on February 12, 2015. Only one course has been submitted for review and approval, HM 101, with a proposed effective term of Fall Term 2016.
- (2) The course title for BA 351 is Managing Organizations; not Introduction to Financial Management.

- (3) The course title for TOL 371 is Eco and Adventure Tourism; not Principles of Ecotourism and Adventure Tourism.
- (4) The required number of credit hours for the program cannot exceed 180. In the online Catalog the total number of credit hours is listed as 181-190.  
Recommendation: Change the total number of credit hours from 181-190 to 180.
- (5) Each of the foreign language courses are 4 credit hours, not 3.  
Recommendation: Change the credit hours from (18) to (24)
- (6) The number of credit hours listed for the Baccalaureate Core is incorrect.  
Recommendation: Indicate a total range of (47-56) or simply change the total to (48). The total number of credit hours required for the Bac Core, including DPD and excluding WIC is 48 credit hours. In addition, it is assumed that a HM 400-level Advanced Hospitality (Capstone) (4) course will be developed as the WIC course for the program. Is this assumption correct?
- (7) An asterisk (\*) has been included as part of most of the listed courses. Only ECON 201 is a Bacc Core Course outside the Baccalaureate Core heading. The WIC course (^) has not been developed.  
Recommendation: Remove the asterisk as indicated on the reviewed proposal pages.
- (8) The Cascades Culinary Institute needs to be contacted to developed five courses for both face-to-face and online delivery, and the existing CUL 110 course for online delivery. If this is not possible, would the program be structure as a “Hybrid” program requiring both online and on-campus attendance?.
- (9) The planned course numbers for the HM courses should be identified. For now, an HM XXX entry has been included where appropriate. Also, HM 410 was entered for the three internship experiences.
- (10) There are enforced prerequisite courses for several of the required courses that would prevent a student from completing the program without these courses also being developed for online delivery; e.g., BA 215, AEC 250.

Based on this review and the myriad of issues that this review has shown to currently exist, it is the recommendation of the Office of Academic Programs, Assessment, and Accreditation that this proposal, to extend the BS in Hospitality Management program from OSU-Cascades to distant locations via online delivery by Ecampus, be placed on hold until the issues identified above have been resolved.
