Response to COB concerns

We appreciate the feedback from COB yet recognize that LEAD (Leadership) is what we teach in our department. This is and has been recognized by our university for many years. LEAD 342 is a current course, has been offered for the past 7-8 years, is popular with students (currently has 99 students enrolled this quarter from 9 colleges on campus), and clearly communicates content that is much broader and different from Business Administration and Management. Our university designator of LEAD, searchable as Leadership in the schedule of classes, supports leadership education as a content area that is clearly within our purview.

OSU students are eager to learn about how to work together in teams, love the class, and appreciate the fact that it is taught from a leadership education perspective that is applicable to their interests and diverse careers. Furthermore, our LEAD (Leadership) classes are open to any OSU student and are not restricted. This supports our belief that leadership education should be accessible to all. This is contrasted with the COB business management courses that are discipline specific, focused on Business Administration (BA) and Management (MGMT), and are restricted to students enrolled in the COB. Our leadership education courses are applicable to all students and are not restricted.

Our LEAD (Leadership) education program, which encompass 12 graduate LEAD courses, 10 undergraduate LEAD courses, served over 540 students this past year representing nine different colleges on campus. Leadership Education is what we teach, we have faculty with significant expertise in this area, and we have offered these courses and our campus-wide Leadership Minor for many years.
