Program Description

Completion of the Teaching Program results in a Master of Arts in Teaching and recommendation for an Oregon teaching license in a particular subject area or in multiple subjects (elementary). This program requires a minimum of 45 credits which includes a course in foundations of ESOL instruction and at least 15 credits in internships and/or practicum that provide classroom observation and teaching practice. In addition, a minimum of three credits are required in each of the InTASC categories: The Learner and Learning, Instructional Practice, Professional Responsibility, and Content Specialty.
