

# **OSU Faculty Senate News**

November 9, 2022

The OSU Faculty Senate represents academic and research faculty (tenure, tenure-track and fixed-term), as well as professional faculty. There is no minimum FTE for Faculty Senate inclusion. The defined faculty ranks appear in Article III of the Bylaws at <a href="https://senate.oregonstate.edu/bylaws">https://senate.oregonstate.edu/bylaws</a>.

The purpose of the newsletter is to update faculty on upcoming opportunities and events, as well as information items related to the Faculty Senate.

### 1. October Faculty Senate Action Items

- Motion to approve: The Faculty Senate of Oregon State University ratifies the revised Baccalaureate Core structure as presented in the Baccalaureate Core Reform Committee Report and Proposal. The motion passed with 101 votes in favor, 11 votes in opposition and 8 abstentions.
- Motion to approve: Faculty Senate will institute a Baccalaureate Core Implementation Budget Committee to operate concurrently with the Baccalaureate Core Implementation Committee. Working with the Baccalaureate Core Director, the committee will review the series of budget investment scenarios discussed with university administration developed during Phase II. Moving forward, the committee will review the adequacy of resources needed for implementation of the curricular changes, course development, and additional capacity needed to develop and lead new categories within the proposed program as recommended by the Faculty Senate. Additionally, the committee will examine anticipated workshops, mentoring opportunities, and trainings to develop new courses or revise existing ones. The committee will consist of ten faculty members, up to two undergraduate student members, and the Associate Vice President of Budget and Resource Planning and the Baccalaureate Core Director serving exofficio, non-voting. Motion passed with 65 votes in favor, 34 votes in opposition and 11 abstentions.

#### 2. General Education Implementation

The General Education Implementation work is underway. We are seeking 40-50 faculty volunteers (academic and professional faculty) to create learning outcomes and criteria for each of the new categories in the curriculum. We need the expertise of faculty from diverse disciplines with enthusiasm for undergraduate education and improving student outcomes to join in this effort. # 4. <u>Indicating Interest in Serving as a Faculty Senator OR Declining Faculty</u> Senator Election

To ensure inclusivity, all currently employed academic, research, extension and professional faculty, regardless of FTE, are eligible to be elected to a Faculty Senator position and represent faculty in their respective Faculty Senate apportionment unit.

If you wish to either **decline** to have your name placed on the Senator Nomination Ballot, or you wish to indicate a **strong interest** in serving if elected, please complete and submit the survey at <a href="https://oregonstate.qualtrics.com/jfe/form/SV 9sNh5HbNJyr0BuK">https://oregonstate.qualtrics.com/jfe/form/SV 9sNh5HbNJyr0BuK</a> no later than Noon on November 14. Faculty must decline each year.

If one wishes to indicate to their colleagues that they have a strong interest in serving as a Faculty Senator, if elected, a designator will be placed next to their name on the ballot to indicate their interest.

Executive Levels 1, 2 and 3 (typically, dean or above) are excluded from being elected, as are Senators who are completing two consecutive three-year terms, a current Senator whose term extends beyond December 31, 2021 or faculty who are on LWOP.

#### 5. Ally Accessibility Platform

University Information and Technology Academic Technologies is planning the next-phase adoption and communication strategy for the Ally accessibility platform, which was integrated with Canvas in March 2022.

The vendor partner is offering a series of planning and feedback sessions. Faculty are invited and encouraged to attend the second session, which focuses on faculty support needs to create and improve accessible content. Your ideas and feedback will help inform the plan for support resources.

Faculty are welcome at any and all of the three sessions, which will be conducted via web conference.
